

What is Screen Distance?

Starting in iOS 17 and iPadOS 17, Screen Distance is turned on by default for children under 13 in a Family Sharing group.

Viewing something such as a device or book too closely for an extended period of time can increase eyestrain and the risk of myopia. The Screen Distance feature in Screen Time uses the True Depth camera to detect when you hold your iPhone closer than 30 cm (12 inches) for an extended period, and encourages you to move it further away. Screen Distance can help children engage in healthy viewing habits that can lower their risk of myopia and can give people of all ages the opportunity to reduce digital eyestrain.

Screen Distance is turned on by default for children under 13* in a Family Sharing group. If you don't want Screen Distance turned on, you can turn it off in iPhone or iPad settings.

To make sure that your Screen Distance settings sync across devices, update all of the devices in your Family Sharing group to the latest software version before changing your Screen Distance settings.
