- locate countries in each of the continents on a world map and identify some of their features

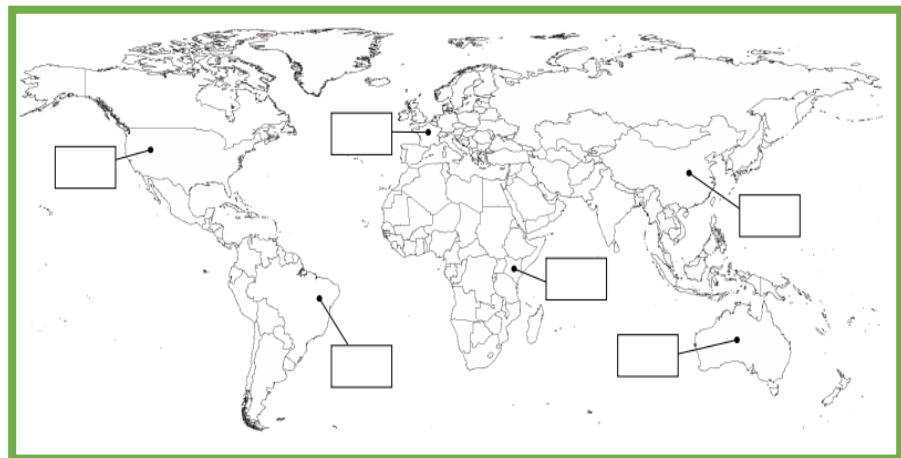
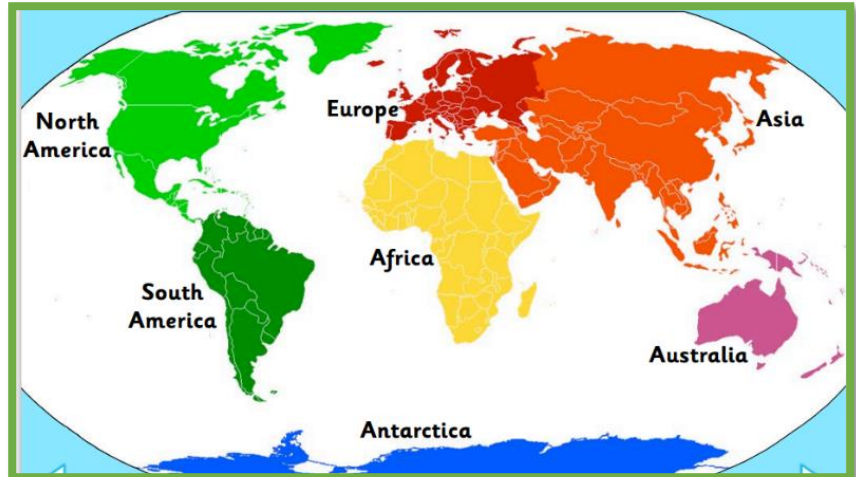
What I Already Know

Children know about similarities and differences in relation to a place. They talk about the features of their own immediate environment.

- How many continents are the world split into?
- Can you locate all the continents on a world map?
- Can you locate United Kingdom, France, China, Australia, Kenya, the U.S.A and Brazil on the map?
- Can you say which continents each of these countries belong in?
- Do you know some of the features of each country, e.g. capital city, food, language, animals, landmarks and currency?

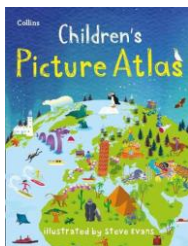
continent	one of the earth's major land masses
