After the Easter break, we will be learning:

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

- To talk about who is in our families.
- To be friendly with the children in the class. New children will be joining us at the start of the summer term. The staff and children will be helping to settle these children in at the Nursery.

Communication & Language/ Understanding the World:


- To talk about what we did with our families during the Easter holidays.

Literacy:

- We will be revising the letter names and sounds that we have learnt so far.
- We will continue to learn about 'alliteration'. We will be making collections of objects with names beginning with the same sound, for example, flower, frog, and fish. We will be singing a song, 'What have we got in our sound box today?' and then showing the objects one at a time, emphasising the initial sound (e.g. f-f-f-flower, f-f-f-frog, f-f-f-fish). At home, you could reinforce this by making your own collection of objects with the same sound with your child.

Mathematics:

- To link numerals to amounts. The children will be counting out different sets of objects and matching them to the correct number. At home, you could write numbers from 1 to 5 on different pieces of paper. You can encourage your child to find the correct number of objects from around your home to match the numbers.



Physical Development:

- To use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils. Most of the children are now holding a pencil with a comfortable grip. If your child finds this tricky, please practise this skill at home with them over the Easter holidays.

Expressive Arts & Design:

- We will be painting pictures about what we did during the Easter holidays.
